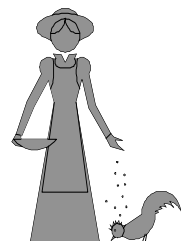
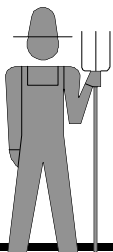

BENCH EXHIBIT GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

Please familiarize yourself with the rules and regulations.

NOTE: "Judging Standards", with hints on showing, can be viewed at the local Bentley library.

1. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE THE ORIGINAL WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR, and NEVER have been entered here before. Preference is given to those completed in the last year.
2. Exhibits **must conform completely** to the description of the class or they may be disqualified. Exhibitors NAME TO BE COVERED for judging. No exhibit will be accepted by mail.
3. Exhibitors can pick up entry tags for each of their exhibits at the Bentley Town Office. Entry tags should be filled out and attached securely to each entry before bringing them in. Please include phone number on entry tag. State age if senior or if under 17 years old. Enter "junior / senior exhibit" by age of when project was completed, not by current age.
4. **Most bench exhibit entries accepted** at the Curling Rink Tuesday evening, Aug. 3 between 7:00 and 8:30 p.m. or Wednesday morning, Aug. 4 between 9:30 and 11:30 a.m. Exceptions: BAKING and HORTICULTURE entries taken Wednesday morning only. **The absolute deadline for accepting exhibits is Wednesday at 11:30 a.m. except "School" SCHOOL EXHIBITS** accepted ahead of time at school or Tues., Aug. 3 until 1:00 p.m. at rink. Submit "Best Dressed Town Yard" nominations by July 31.
5. The **Entry Fee** is 50¢ per item, except "School Exhibits" which are free and get no cash prizes.
6. Exhibitors are limited to **1** entry per class or subsection unless otherwise specified. If more items are brought than allowed, the extra exhibit(s) will be entered for display only. Exception: Drawing/Painting/Framed Photos: 2 entries / class unless otherwise specified.
7. Some sections have "Special Instructions" and / or "Special Prizes" listed.
8. Modified Danish Judging System used. Prizes given for the quality of the work. Ex. If 2 merit the same prize, 2 will be given. If no exhibit merits a "first place", NO first will be given. If no exhibit merits any prize, then NO prizes will be given. Not all exhibits receive prizes.
9. Unless otherwise specified prizes will be: 1st.- \$5.00, 2nd.- \$4.00, and 3rd.- \$3.00.
10. Bench Exhibit Special Prizes for all categories will be presented at 12:30 p.m. on Friday, at the Bentley Curling Rink. (Trophies & Special Prizes are listed with individual sections.)
11. Pick-up of displays and prize money is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor. No exhibit is to be removed until after prize presentations ceremony therefore exhibitors must be prepared to leave exhibits until at least 1:30 p.m. on Friday or prizes may be forfeited. **Pick up between 1:30 and 2:30 p.m. on Friday**. Any entry left after that time will be disposed of at the discretion of the committee.
12. PUBLIC VIEWING of exhibits on Thursday after the Parade until 6:30 p.m. and on Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The public is invited to the 12:30 Awards Presentations on Friday. **ABSOLUTELY NO PUBLIC VIEWING** during judging on Wednesday.
13. If the total number of exhibits in any class is three or less the Committee shall be at liberty to amalgamate similar exhibits. Judges decision for placings is final.
14. Committee / judge reserves the right to disqualify any exhibit. The Bentley Town & Country Fair Board reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the Rules and Regulations.
15. The Bentley Town & Country Fair board **WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DAMAGE OR INJURIES RECEIVED** or damage to or loss of any exhibit.

ENTRY TAGS FOR ALL BENCH EXHIBITS

Tags can be picked up at the town office ahead of time. The tags must be filled out fully and attached securely to each exhibit before the article will be accepted and/ or put on display. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be sure the item being entered is entered in the proper class and conforms exactly with ALL criteria for its category to ensure the item is accepted and not disqualified.

Complete the section (Baking, Sewing, Art, etc.) and the class number. A short description of entry goes in "Exhibit". Fill out name, address, phone number. Include age if entering age division (especially important for youth and seniors). After acceptance and payment of entry fee, Exhibitor Number may be assigned.

ALL WORK must be original. NO TRACING or "PAINT BY NUMBER". Reproductions to be marked "COPY". No "PRINTS" allowed. Works must be clearly labeled with name, address, and the class being entered. No image to be larger than 20" x 24" (50 cm X 61 cm).

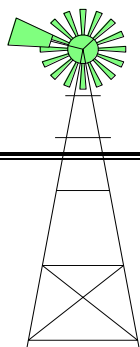

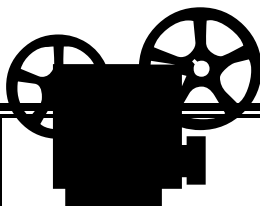
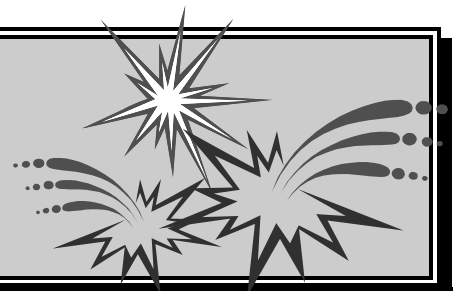
